in 2003 after the drought became to much. We found a property we fell in love with, 120 acres with running creeks and made it our own. Fast forward another 10 years.. and something was missing. We had been out of the game for so long we didn't recognise any familiar names or prefixes.. even so it sparked something inside us, an excitement to get back into what we love.

A year went past and our kids and myself all decided to bite the bullet and all put in for Bills birthday. We surprised him and bought him a Appaloosa Colt he had circled in his magazine. The rest is history.

Stable upgrades & Clean up

Not that our mares (or any mares) stick to their estimated due date but we have been working around the clock upgrading our foaling down stables and individual yards. We have 6 mares due all close together end of August / early September. We needed to make sure we can accommodate them all at the same time. We have added two more stables and yards and now have 8 altogether. After the 2019/2020 bushfires that swept through our property, we are still cleaning up and replacing boundary and internal fences. There never a dull moment or never a project not needed to be done!


